About Us

The success of the August 1990 Heritage Days Celebration gave birth to the Lovells Township Historical Society.

The community at large expressed a desire to preserve and promote the history of the area. That aspiration brought together people seeking a way to display and protect the artifacts, documents, photos and memories of Lovells.

Rudolph Pallone's 1991 gift to the Society of the one room log school house known as the Lone Pine School, constructed in 1906 by James Kellogg and Gustav Ernst, became the first big project for the newly formed historical society.

With help from the community the historic building was moved to the township property and renovations began in the summer of 1991. Once completed, the building was used to house and exhibit the history of Lovells Township.

The schoolhouse today continues to showcase family histories and in 2001 was joined by a new log building that chronicles the past and present fishing accounts of the world famous North Branch of the Au Sable River


