## A Word From Our Fire Chief....

A little over two decades ago the very first Lovells Bridge Walk took place. Since then every year on the third Satur-



day in August people in Lovells wake up to the smell of pancakes ham, sausage and hot coffee. Years ago, it started with a conversation by a few locals over beers at the tavern. They were thinking up ideas on how best to thank the Volunteer Fire Department. The idea of the Lovells Famous Bridge Walk was born. Initially the draw was just a few people, some music, a lot of laughs and no doubts a few beers

too after waking the bridge. As the fire department grew and EMS personnel were added, gradually the main focus of the Bridge Walk began to shift from a celebration to a fund raising event. Over the years it has grown from a small gathering to a full day of fun for the entire community. It is now our annual fund raiser. The feelings of gratitude from the people of Lovells to their first responders still remains first and foremost and the department enjoys the day of celebration just the same today as they did at that first Bridge Walk.

What many of you probably don't know is what your support at the Bridge Walk has been able to provide for us ... Those t-shirts, sweat shirts and hats you've purchased along with other generous donations on Bridge Walk day have been able to provide your First Responders with many tools and equipment that we might not otherwise have.

Among the many pieces of equipment, tools and clothing purchased with Bridge Walk money we were able to purchase two vehicles...the first being a Suburban used for EMS...purchased entirely with Bridge Walk funds and then later a Chevy Truck was purchased partially with Bridge Walk money!





Over the years we purchased our hose tester (required for an annual testing to ensure that our hoses meet specifications) telescoping flood lights on the back of our equipment trailer, a low level strainer used for filling the tankers from creek water, LED Smoke Cutter Helmet Lights, "Jaws of Life" with power pack, portable generators with flood lights, the 800 MHz tower antenna you see on the top of the fire hall which is necessary for our radios, a tool box used to store our tools to help maintain our equipment, a stair chair which is critical to assist patients up and down stairs for transport, the fire danger sign, one of three AED's and a portion of the purchase and installation of the two new fuel tanks behind the fire hall was funded with Bridge Walk money. Most recently, with

last year's Bridge Walk donations, we were finally able to purchase all new Wildland Fire Boots for the entire department; after years of tending to fires without this style boot they were much needed and very much appreciated.
