LOVELLS BRIDGE ACCESS SITE UPDATE

Construction of the access site on the state owned/township leased land at the County Road 612 bridge over the North Branch of the Au Sable commenced late last fall. In early January of this year, with winter weather firmly established, construction was paused until this past April. By May trees and vegetation had been removed from the area that will become the parking lot, and removal of trees and vegetation commenced to create the 160' long pathway that will connect the parking lot to the river. The COVID-19 pandemic has caused some delay, due primarily to the strict protocols the DNR's construction crew must work under. We're hopeful of a 2021 completion, with the grant's required completion date being well into 2022.

At our last Board Meeting, Ron Larson, Crawford County Road Commissioner, reported that the **Twin Bridge Road Repaying Project** will commence this Summer 2021! Also, he stated that our US House Representative Jack Bergman is working with several people in Washington to repave County Road 612!

NATURAL VEGETATION STRIP REVIEW

Late last year a significant unauthorized removal of trees from within the natural vegetative strip occurred at a waterfront parcel in the township. The remediation of this unauthorized removal is underway, and it is being done at the expense of the parcel owner

Along the North Branch of the Au Sable the strip extends seventy five feet landward from the ordinary high water mark. Along all other streams and all lakes it extends landward fifty feet from the ordinary high water mark. Within the strip trees and shrubs may be selectively pruned to achieve a filtered view of the water from the principal structure and for reasonable private access to the water. Dead, diseased, unsafe or fallen trees, and noxious plants and shrubs such as poison ivy and other plants regarded as a common nuisance may be removed from the vegetation strip. Planting of perennial native species in the strip is encouraged, especially where exposed soil and steep slopes exist and in reforestation efforts.

Automatic Generators Are Coming! By Gary Neumann, Supervisor

At their April 13, 2021 meeting the Lovells Township Board voted unanimously to install an automatic Generac standby generator at the Township Hall and at the Township Fire Barn. The installation of standby electrical power has been discussed by the board a number of times over the years. With substantial 4/1/2021 carryover balances in the General and Fire Funds the board decided it was the right time to execute this option. The major benefit, in the board's opinion, is that in the event of a widespread and lengthy power outage residents would have a warm and well-lit place to charge cell phones, get drinking water, or heat up a meal. Because of the location of existing electrical power and propane entry points into the hall and barn it was cheaper to install two smaller generators versus a single large one.
