

Disposal of Large Household Items

A **LARGE ITEM DISPOSAL TICKET** and a dump permit are required in order to dispose of larger household items (chairs, mattresses, etc.) at either location. Large item tickets can be purchased for \$5.00 each at the Township Hall, Lovells EZ-mart, Kellogg Bridge Grocery or Lovells Home Center.

With (1) one \$5 large item ticket you may dispose of (1) one of the following: a chair, a table, an end table, any size mattress or box spring (but **ALL** sizes need to be cut in half), a TV, a bookcase, a four drawer or smaller dresser, a toilet or sink.

With (2) two \$5 large item tickets you may dispose of (1) one of the following: a couch, a love seat, a large recliner, a sofa bed (but the metal frame must be removed), a ceramic tub or hot tub, (but they must be broken up).

We are **NOT ALLOWED** and therefore **DO NOT** accept:

- Construction materials (shingles, cement, lumber, etc.)
- Hazardous materials
- Auto or truck tires
- Cans of paint
- Motor Oil
- Dead animals or fish of any size, nor the entrails of wild game or fish

The Center attendants have been authorized by the Township Board to refuse any item or items that they deem to be excessive in quantity, hazardous or inappropriate.

Lovells Township Compactor and Recycle Centers

- **North Center** is located on Old County Rd 612
- **South Center** is located on North Down River Rd

A free **DUMP PERMIT** is required in order to deposit household trash at either center. Permits are available at the Township Hall (Tu/We/Th 9am-3pm) or by mail to all who own improved (with a dwelling) property in Lovells Township.

Regular Hours:

- Wednesday and Saturdays: Noon- 4pm
- Sundays: 9am- 1pm

Holiday Hours:

- Closed Christmas and Easter
 - (Open Monday after Easter 9am- 1pm)
- Open 9am-1pm the Mondays after:
 - Memorial Day, 4th of July and Labor Day weekends.

Please do not leave items at the gate when it is closed!

Please break down all boxes, crush plastic bottles as best as you can and flatten cans before placing into recycle container.
